Barbour County Fair is known statewide as one of the oldest and biggest fairs in West Virginia. Our Barbour County Fair Association board of directors take pride in keeping up with those expectations. We were able to maintain our 2023 Schedule events without modifications. Unlike the past two years with COVID restrictions, with having no fair at all or several modications to make certain events still happen. Weather plays an important factor with an event. The first couple of days were wet, but had the largest number of parade entries in its history. Senior Day was down in numbers due to nursing homes not being able to bring residents out, but still well attended. Derby nights are always a hit regardless. The rest of the week brough perfect weather. 3rd grade day we had 200 students and Educational Day we had 125 students. Both days had 28 learning stations that included WV Raptors, grist mill making corn meal, butter making, nutrition, behavioral health focusing on stress reduction with stress balls, WV Prevention Solutions with Teen Suicide, exhibits, Fender Blender, ATV safety, Barn skill a thon, Immunizations, WV Birds of Prey, WVDNR reptiles, Save the Tygart Water, money management, fingerprinting, colleges, goat show, beekeeping, Foy Boy racing, and more. For the first time we puchased fresh fruits and veggies through the Philippi Garden Market for POP Up Markets for children who attended educational days. They were able to select what they wanted to take home. The market was lead by WVU Extension and the CEOS group. Barbour County is one of the highest counties for food insecurities. Other popular events included the youth and adult ATV racing. Nashville acts that included Confederate Railroad an the ever popular Chase Mathews packed the house. Gambil Amusements provided the rides. We were not able to have the material of or 3rd grade or educational days due to the rising cost of diesel fuel. The next time we will look to see what the additional cost would be and try to assist where possible. Food vendors were happy with the turn out for the week. Other vendors were down as a result from prior years of COVID some have closed up shop or found other locations once we did not have our fair for two years. Livestock market animal sales was at their highest.banners for Livestock show/sale. OEM/911 provided Safety tabletop senerios prior to the fair to assist us in making our event safe for fairgoers and our community. The funding from this grant made it possible to enhance our education to the community. Based on fair attendance of 20,000+, we have deemed our event a success not only for our organization, but to other community stakeholders as well. We achieved our purpose ane objectives of our organization. To provide all citizens of Barbour County an opportunity to enjoy in a relaxed atmosphere a County Fair that shall provide wholesome family recreation and entertainment and to cooperate with the Barbour County Commission, owners of the principal palce of business, to maintain facilities such as buildings and grounds for that purpose. To Promote farming, indurstry and business in Barbour County and the State of WV. To provide for, display, and promote the sale of livestock, crops, other agricultural products manufactured/produced in Barbour County and WV. To sponsor, establish, and promote educational meetings, seminars, lectures for the benefit of all citizens. To promote all aspects of Barbour County and WV life, culture, arts, crafts, and music.
